 - a. Fifteen (15) practice focused contact hours from a nationally recognized or state continuing education approval body
 - b. recognized by the ASBN; or
 - c. Certification or re-certification during the renewal period by a national certifying body recognized by the ASBN; or
 - d. An academic course in nursing or related field; and
 - e. Provide other evidence as requested by the Board.
2. Standards for Nurses on Inactive Status - Nurses who have their license placed on inactive status have no requirements for continuing education.
3. Standards for Reinstatement of Active Licensure Status
 - a. Nurses reinstating a nursing license to active status after five years or less shall document completion of the following within the past two (2) years:
 - i) Twenty (20) practice focused contact hours within the past two years from a nationally recognized or state continuing education approval body recognized by the ASBN, or
 - ii) Certification or re-certification by a national certifying body recognized by the ASBN; or
 - iii) An academic course in nursing or related field; and/or
 - iv) Provide other evidence as requested by the Board.
 - b. Nurses reinstating a nursing license to active status after greater than five years shall document completion of the following within the past two (2) years:
 - i) Twenty (20) practice focused contact hours within the past two years from a nationally recognized or state continuing education approval body recognized by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing, or
 - ii) Certification or re-certification by a national certifying body recognized by the ASBN; or
 - iii) An academic course in nursing or related field; and
 - iv) A refresher course approved by the ASBN; or
 - v) An employer competency orientation program, and
 - vi) Provide other evidence as requested by the Board.
4. The Board may issue a temporary permit to a nurse during the time enrolled in a Board-approved nursing refresher course or an employer competency orientation program upon submission of an application, fees and verification of enrollment in such program.

5. Continuing education hours beyond the required contact hours shall not be “carried over” to the next renewal period.

Courses approved by appropriate state, regional and national health professional associations as well as other professional health and licensing boards in and out of California can be acceptable, so long as the content meets the Board's requirements as specified in Title 16, CCR, Section 1456. These courses must be developed for continuing education purposes.

- Courses taken in another state, so long as the course is acceptable by that state's Board of Nursing for continuing education.
- Courses approved by ANCC (American Nurses Credentialing Center) approved regional accrediting bodies when these courses are taken out-of-state.
- Courses offered in California by out-of-state organizations, associations, corporations, individuals, must have a BRN approved CEP number.

Registered nurses, in the State of California, are required by law (Section 1451, Article 5, of the California Code of Regulations) to complete thirty (30) hours of continuing education (CE) every two years (in addition to paying the renewal fee), to maintain an active license. Continuing education courses must have been completed during the preceding renewal period (when renewing), or during the preceding two years (when renewing a delinquent or lapsed license, or going from an inactive to active license). Courses must be taken through a continuing education provider recognized by the Board of Registered Nursing (BRN).

The content of all courses of continuing education must be relevant to the practice of nursing. Learning experiences are expected to enhance the knowledge of the registered nurse at a level above that required for licensure. Courses must be related to the scientific knowledge and/or technical skills required for the practice of nursing, or be related to direct and/or indirect patient/client care.

Courses related to the scientific knowledge for the practice of nursing include basic and advanced courses in the physical, social, and behavioral sciences, as well as advanced nursing in general or specialty areas. Content which includes the application of scientific knowledge to patient care in addition to advanced nursing courses may include courses in related areas, e.g. human sexuality; death, dying, and grief; foreign languages (conversational); therapeutic interpersonal relationship skills; pharmacology; and those related to specialty areas of nursing practice.

Courses in nursing administration, management, education, research or other functional areas of nursing relating to indirect patient/client care would be acceptable.

Continuing Education is required of all nurses licensed by the State of Delaware as a part of maintaining current licensure. The continuing education must have been obtained from a Delaware Board of Nursing approved provider. Few providers seek approval directly from the Board, i.e., submit an application to be recognized. Most meet the definition of an approved provider found in Section 9.1 of the Board's Rules and Regulations – that is, they are either "...a nationally accredited provider of nursing related continuing education..." or are "...an organization or agency approved as a provider or has programs that are approved by a nationally accredited approver of nursing related continuing education." The Delaware Nurses Association is an example of an organization approved as a provider by a nationally accredited approver. The "nationally accredited approver" in this case is the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC).

A provider who has been approved by applying to be recognized specifically by the Delaware Board of Nursing is required to issue certificates of completion on which they attest to the fact that they are an approved provider of continuing education for nurses by the Delaware Board of Nursing. The certificate must include a specific "provider number." Nursing education programs approved by the Delaware Board are also recognized as approved providers of continuing education. You can find other approved methods of earning continuing education hours that meet the licensure requirements in Section 9.3 of the Rules and Regulations. The complete Rules and Regulations are available on the Board's website: www.dpr.delaware.gov/boards/nursing .

All RNs must complete 24 hours of appropriate CE during each 24 month renewal period. One contact hour is required for each calendar month of the licensure cycle, including two hours on Prevention of Medical Errors. HIV/AIDS course is now a one-time one hour CE requirement to be completed prior to the first renewal. Domestic Violence CE is now a two hour requirement every third renewal. RNs who also hold an ARNP certificate may satisfy the CE requirements for both licenses by completing appropriate courses for an RN, or may satisfy up to 50% of the requirement by completing continuing medical education coursework.

- k. Presenter/lecturer presentations made to other health professionals on topics related to the certification area may be used for CE credit. Each different individual, non-repetitive 60-minute lecture may be used for 5 CE hours. Full-time educators may not use presentations/lectures that are part of their job expectations, but may use guest lectures and other presentations made outside the duties of their job.
- l. CE hours may be earned for authoring papers, publications, dissertations, book chapters or research projects. These must be applicable to the certification area. The research project must

be completed during the prerenewal period. Authoring a paper or publication article may be used for 10 CE hours. Authoring a book chapter, dissertation or research project may be used for 20 CE hours.

- m. CE hours may be earned through preceptorship of an APN student. Preceptors must provide clinical supervision and education to the APN student. Documentation must be provided from the school of nursing in which the student is enrolled. Precepting one student for an academic semester or quarter may be used for 10 CE hours. Not more than 20 CE hours in each renewal period may come from precepting.
- n. Successful completion, during the prerenewal period, of a recertification exam in the APNS area of specialty as recognized in Section 1305.20 may be used for 50 CE hours.

CE Requirements:

Registered Nurses and Licensed Practical Nurses are not required to obtain continuing education for licensure renewal. Certified Nurse Midwives with limited licenses are not required to obtain continuing education for licensure renewal. Advanced Practice Nurses with Prescriptive Authority must obtain at least thirty (30) hours of continuing education, at least eight (8) hours of which must be in pharmacology.

Applicants for renewal of Prescriptive Authority shall submit proof of completion of the mandatory continuing education at the time of renewal. Acceptable continuing education programs must be approved by a nationally approved sponsor of continuing education for advanced practice nurses.

Acceptable continuing education programs must be approved by a nationally approved sponsor of continuing education for nurses and approved by the Board and contained on a list at the Indiana Professional Licensing Agency.

- For renewal of a three year license, the requirement is 36 contact hours or 3.6 CEUs.
- For renewal of a license that has been issued for less than three years, the requirement is 24 contact hours or 2.4 CEUs. This applies to the first renewal after any one of the following:
 - Initial Iowa licensure by examination
 - Initial Iowa licensure by endorsement from another state
 - Reactivation from an inactive status

A license issued for less than three years is granted for two years, plus the number of months to the birth month. Thereafter, the license must be renewed every three years.

- For reactivation from an inactive status, the requirement is 12 contact hours that are not more than 12 months old at the time the credit is submitted for reactivation.
- Mandatory Training On Abuse Identification and Reporting.
It is also mandated that a person who regularly examines, attends, counsels or treats dependent adults or children in Iowa, must accurately document compliance with mandatory training requirements on abuse identification and reporting. The course must have been completed within the last 5 years, and be a course that is approved by the Iowa Department of Public Health Abuse Education Review Panel. The training must also be two hours in length.

Type of CE accepted:

1. All on-site continuing education courses held within the state of Iowa, are required to be offered by an approved Iowa Board of Nursing provider. Courses that come into Iowa via distance learning technologies such as satellite conferences or teleconferences are also included in this requirement. The provider's approval should be evident, because the provider number is required to appear on the written advertisement.

CE Requirements:

Nurses are required to earn 14 contact hours or the equivalent within the yearly earning period of November 1st through October 31st. ARNPs must have 2 hours of HIV continuing education every ten years.

Type of CE accepted:

Certain college credit courses may be used to meet CE requirements. Nursing courses, designated by a nursing course number, and courses in physical and social sciences such as Psychology, Biology, and Sociology will count toward CE hours. One semester credit hour equals 15 contact hours; one quarter credit hour equals 12 contact hours.

If a college course does not fall within these designated categories, and a nurse feels the course is applicable to his/her nursing practice, an [Application for Individual Request for Review of CE Activities](#) [PDF Format - 71k] may be submitted to KBN for review of the course. There is a \$10 non-refundable fee for this service.

Prelicensure general education courses, either electives or designated to meet degree requirements, are not acceptable. CPR/BLS, in-service education, or nurse aide training are not acceptable for nursing CE.

 - Employee orientation, subject matter, standard operating procedure of the employing agency shall not qualify for continuing education purposes under 244 CMR 5.00.
 - Subject matter shall be described in outline form and shall include learner objectives, content, time allotment, teaching methods, faculty and evaluation format.
 - Types of continuine education should be included (see definition "Types").
- c. The following guidelines are applicable to the selection of a continuing education program/offering and/or planning implementation of a program/offering.
 - When the type is an academic course, the following applies: The course must be within the framework of curriculum that leads to an academic degree in nursing or relevant to nursing, or any course within that curriculum that is necessary to an individual's professional growth and development.
 - When the type of continuing education is designated as a self-study offering or a correspondence course, the course should:
 - Be developed by a professional group such as an educational corporation or professional association.
 - Follow a logical sequence.
 - Involves the learner by requiring active response to module materials and provide feedback.
 - Contain a test to indicate progress and verify completion of module.
 - Supply a bibliography for continued study.
 - When the type of continuing education is designated as a planned and supervised clinical experience, the course:
 - Should be beyond the basic level of preparation of the individual who is licensed and be based on a planned program of study.
 - The instructor-supervisor should possess the appropriate credentials related to the discipline being taught.
 - The experience should take place in a clinical setting.
- d. Education Methods
 - Learning experiences and teaching methods should be appropriate to achieve the objectives of the offering/program.

- Principles of adult education should be used in the design of the offering/program.
 - Time allotted for each activity should be sufficient for the learner to meet the objectives of the offering.
 - Facilities and educational resources should be adequate to implement the offerings/programs.
- e. Faculty Qualifications
- The faculty should present documentation to the provider/learner illustrating competency in the content of the planned learning experience and possess knowledge of the principles of adult education.
 - If the offering includes a clinical nursing component, a licensed qualified nurse in Massachusetts shall provide supervision.
 - If the offering includes a clinical component other than nursing, a qualified instructor possessing the appropriate credentials of the discipline shall provide instruction.
- f. Evaluation.
- Provision must be made for evaluating the participant's attainment of the stated learner objectives/outcomes.
 - Participants must be given the opportunity to evaluate faculty, learning experiences, instructional methods, facilities and educational resources used for the offering/programs.
- g. Records.
- Records of offerings/programs should be kept by the provider for a period of four years.
 - Records should include content, objectives, outline of offering, faculty qualifications, teaching methods and materials, evaluation tools and data and a list of participants.
 - The provider shall furnish to each participant an authenticated record of attendance specifying provider, title of offering, date of offering, number of contact hours and successful completion of program/offering.

(1) Basic life support (BLS) or cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR);

(2) Repetition of any educational activity with identical content and course objectives within a single reporting period;

(10) Membership in a nursing or dialysis technician organization; or

(11) Development and presentation of continuing education or other educational activity; however, faculty may be awarded continuing education credit for attendance at all parts of a continuing education activity they do not present.

Thus, some of the offerings that may be appropriate include:

CME, Pharmacy offerings, medical journal CE, etc.

If you attend a full day(s) seminar, only part of which is pharmacology, count only the sessions that can reasonably be considered to be pharmacology. Keep documentation such as outlines/time schedules for the seminars.

Pharmacology Requirement: If you obtained INITIAL prescriptive authority (CTP-E) AFTER 9/1/2003:

The pharmacology CE is prorated if you have not held prescriptive authority for a full 2-year cycle. That is, your Pharmacology CE requirement is 6 hr of pharmacology obtained between 9/1/2003 and 8/31/2005. You may count pharmacology CE hours obtained in that timeframe even before being approved for prescriptive authority.

The Pharmacology course used to obtain prescriptive authority may not be counted for the ongoing pharmacology CE that is required for prescribers.

BUT, you may count 24 of the original pharm course hours toward the RN renewal requirement (described above) PROVIDED THE COURSE WAS TAKEN BETWEEN 9/1/2003 and 8/31/2005. If the pharmacology course taken to qualify for prescriptive authority was taken prior to September 1, 2003, it does not count for the RN renewal-reporting period from 9/1/2003 to 8/31/2005.

B. If you have held prescriptive authority for a full renewal period (2 years) - (that is held a CTP-E and/or CTP issued on or BEFORE

9/1/2003):

You are required to obtain 12 pharmacology hours between 9/1/2003 and 8/31/2005 (in addition to the 24 hours CE for RN renewal).

On June 29, 2006 Governor Rendell signed into law Act 58 of 2006 (SB 235), which requires thirty (30) hours of Board approved mandatory continuing education (CE) during each two-year license period for individuals licensed as registered nurses in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

School nurses, who as Certified Education Specialists are required to obtain continuing professional education under the Public School Code of 1949 shall be permitted to submit evidence of the completion of education courses approved for their certification by the school district. If you are not a Certified Education Specialist, you will need to complete the 30 CE hours required for all RNs. In lieu of meeting this requirement, Certified Registered Nurse Practitioners (CRNPs) and Licensed Dietitian-Nutritionists (LDNs), can fulfill the CE requirements for their respective certification or license

Pharmacology Requirement:

The CRNP who has prescriptive authority shall complete a minimum of 16 hours of State Board of Nursing approved continuing education in pharmacology in the two years prior to the biennial renewal date of the CRNP certification, as part of the requirement of 30 hours of continuing education biennially.

Academic courses in nursing taken for credit may be used to meet Type I requirements if a grade of C or better or pass on a pass/fail system is achieved. One academic semester hour is equal to 15 contact hours. The courses shall be within the framework of a curriculum that leads to an academic degree in nursing or any academic course relevant to nursing practice/health care. Prerequisite

courses, such as mathematics, government, physiology, etc., do not count. Academic courses related to health care taken for credit, or audited academic courses are accepted for Type II credit.

A Type II program is one which meets the criteria in the Board's rules, but has not been approved by one of the credentialing organizations. A Type II may be a program approved for another healthcare professional, such as a physician or pharmacist, or a program offered by one's employer or other organization. The program, however, must address nursing practice or the provision of health care, include nurses in the target audience, and meet the definition of nursing continuing education. Other activities accepted for Type II credit include program development and presentation, initial certification in a nursing specialty, and authorship

CE Requirements: Beginning January 1, 1997, each registered professional nurse with an active license to practice registered professional nursing in West Virginia shall complete thirty (30) contact hours of continuing education, as approved by this rule, every two calendar years. On or

before December 31, 1999, and every other December 31 thereafter, each registered professional nurse shall file a report of his or her continuing education activities with the board at the time he or she files an application for renewal of his or her license to practice registered professional nursing in West Virginia.

Each applicant for renewal of a license, if the license is currently active, or reinstatement of a license if a license is lapsed or on the non-practicing list, shall verify that he or she has satisfactorily completed thirty (30) contact hours of continuing education during the two (2) year reporting period prescribed in subsection 3.1.1 of this rule.

4.2.5. The provider shall establish a written method to determine whether the participant has achieved the stated objectives of the offering continuing education program. Methods may include but are not limited to self-evaluation check lists or tests.

4.2.6. The provider shall furnish a written statement of completion to each participant who completes each continuing education program. The statement shall be signed by the instructor or an individual designated by the instructor, and shall contain the following information: the name of the continuing education program, the number of contact hours, the date of the continuing education program, and the name of the participant.

4.2.7. The provider shall maintain a record of individuals who attend a continuing education program for a period of not less than three (3) years.

4.5. Continuing education subjects.

4.5.1. Continuing education programs shall reflect the educational needs of the licensee in order to meet the health care needs of the consumer and may consist of one or more of the following subject areas:

- a. Professional nursing practice and special health care problems;
- b. The biological, physical, social and behavioral sciences;
- c. The legal aspects of professional nursing practice;
- d. Management of health care personnel and patient care;
- e. Teaching and learning process for health care personnel or for patients; and

f. Subjects relating to professional nursing practice which are required as part of a formal nursing program and which are more advanced than those completed for original licensure.

4.5.2. The following activities are not acceptable for continuing education credit:

- a. Job related clinical practice;
- b. Development and presentation of programs as part of the licensee's on-going job responsibilities;
- c. Orientation and update of policies and procedures specific to the licensee's employing facility; and
- d. Activities which are part of a licensee's usual job responsibility.

CE Requirements: If qualified by education, the advanced practitioner of nursing shall submit evidence of having completed sixty (60) contact hours of continuing education related to the recognized specialty area(s) of advanced nursing practice and a minimum of four hundred (400) practice hours in advanced nursing practice during the last two (2) years; or If qualified by national certification, the advanced practitioner of nursing shall submit evidence of holding current national certification or recertification as an advanced practitioner of nursing in the recognized specialty area(s) of advanced nursing practice and evidence of having completed thirty (30) contact hours of continuing education related to the specialty area(s) of advanced nursing practice.

(a) For the purposes of this chapter, a nationally recognized professional organization and/or accrediting agency which offers a national certification examination in a specialty area of nursing practice, establishes standards and scope of practice statements, and provides a mechanism for evaluating continued competency in the specialty area of nursing practice, may be accepted by the board as a nationally recognized professional organization and/or accrediting agency. (i) A list of nationally recognized professional organizations and/or accrediting agencies accepted by the board shall be maintained and annually reviewed by the board and made available to the public upon request.

Pharmacology Requirement: The biennial requirement for contact hours of continuing education related to the recognized specialty area(s) of advanced nursing practice may include twelve (12) hours of education in pharmacology and clinical management of drug therapy and/or hours of education relating to national certification.
