I provide abuse evaluations, primary care and urgent care for young people with complex social situations. My passion is strength-based care for all young people, particularly system-involved children, adolescents and young adults.

I have been involved with NAPNAP since 2003 when I served as the student liaison for the Pennsylvania Three Rivers Chapter. As a student, I received a Loretta Ford scholarship to learn from my mentor at a national NAPNAP level and by 2007 I was president of our local chapter.
