Pediatric nurse practitioners (PNPs) care for children from birth through adulthood. PNP responsibilities include:

• perform and interpret diagnostic tests


Pediatric Nurse Practitioners**

- diagnose and treat acute conditions (like infections and injuries) and chronic conditions (like diabetes and asthma)
- perform developmental and behavioral assessments
- prescribe medications and other treatments

Why become a PNP?

- PNPs have greater autonomy than other pediatric nursing roles, and can even practice solo in many states.
- Average annual salary for nurse practitioners is \$121,000*.
- Anticipated 52.2% employment growth in the next 10 years*.
